Teacher Strikes

You are probably aware that the National Educational Union are planning a further 2 days of teacher strikes. The first of these is next **Wednesday** 5th **July**, then again on **Friday** 7th **July**.

Once again, we expect a significant number of our teaching staff to be on strike and we respect their legal right to do so. Of course, the government stance on Teacher's pay and educational funding could change over the coming days, which could therefore influence what happens. However, we expect to be open to one year group as well as a small number of pupils from the other 3 year groups each day. The Year 8 London residential visit will not be affected by the strikes and will go ahead as planned.

On Wednesday 5th we will be OPEN to Year 5 pupils
